Lucy Moses School, Manhattan's largest community arts school, provides classes and lessons in music, dance, and theater to approximately 1,800 children and teenagers and 650 adult students each year. Students study with one of its 140 accomplished faculty members.

Lucy Moses School also serves youth who wish to seriously pursue music studies through its Young Artist Program, which prepares advanced students to study music at college or conservatory through specialized after-school training. 2022–23 saw the launch of our new weeklong SummerFest. Acclaimed pedagogues including Orli Shaham, Richard Goode, and Midori led masterclasses and lessons for advanced high school and college-aged violin, cello, and piano students.

Each year, the Lucy Moses School Scholarship Fund makes programming accessible for 100 young people who are experiencing financial difficulty.

FACE THE MUSIC

Lauded by the *New York Times* as "a force in the New York new-music world," Lucy Moses School's Face the Music is the country's premier youth contemporary music program dedicated to studying and performing music by living composers.

This year, Face the Music worked with guest artists Almog Sharvit, Metropolis Ensemble, Lex Korten, Jules Biber, Elena Moon Park, Clara Kim, and others. In one especially unique workshop, the students made their own open instrumentation graphic scores, which they later performed alongside Metropolis Ensemble members in Riverside Park. Students also collaborated with Kronos Quartet as part of their "50 for the Future" commissioning project.

LUCY MOSES SCHOOL ADULT DIVISION

In the Adult Division, students enjoyed a breadth of music, theater, and dance activities, from chamber music and Dalcroze classes to vocal lessons and choral ensembles. At the end of the year, students celebrated their learnings in a variety of in-person performance opportunities. For instance, adult jazz recitals featured intermediate and advanced mixed instrumental ensembles, a Blues Jam group, and a Jazz Vocal Workshop—which featured students of many ages (18-84).

THE LAUNCH OF PATHWAYS

Lucy Moses School welcomed even more young instrumentalists through the launch of the Pathways program. This initiative creates opportunities for motivated students from under-resourced NYC communities to experience the life-changing benefits of intensive music education.

The Center welcomed its first cohort of late-elementary and early middle-school-aged students for weekly private lessons and group classes and ensembles, free of charge, with its highly qualified instructors at Lucy Moses School. Pathways participants are provided with additional resources for free (e.g., travel, instrument rental, etc.) to eliminate barriers to students' success.

Special Music School (M859) is New York City's only K-12 public school that provides in-depth curricular musical training alongside a rigorous academic education. Founded in 1996 as a unique partnership between Kaufman Music Center and the New York City Department of Education (DOE), the School provides daily music instruction—including private lessons, classes in music theory and history, ensembles, and more—alongside the DOE's academic curriculum, all within the school day.

The Center designs, delivers, and fully funds the School's holistic Music Program, thereby making this intensive music education free for over 300 students from across the five boroughs annually. Through this unique public-private model, Special Music School safeguards students' access to conservatory-level music education regardless of circumstances.

Now in its 33rd year, the Summer Musical Theater Workshop remains one of Lucy Moses School's most popular offerings. Students participate in a five-week intensive program where they study acting, dance and singing and rehearse an original musical written especially for them. The Workshop, which had for its theme "A Spooky Summer," served 83 young New Yorkers ages 6-18, culminating in three fully produced performances in Merkin Hall. Nearly \$20,000 in full and partial scholarships was awarded to families experiencing financial hardship in order to ensure that a truly diverse population of children could participate.

Kaufman Music Center invites children from New York City's under-resourced Title I public schools to attend our school-day performances, free of charge, thanks to the support of our philanthropic partners.

SIMON TOM


